Mental Health: Personality Disorders in Late Life

Personality disorders in the older adult population are not well understood.

Recognition of personality disorders often come when support networks disappear leaving the older adult without the skills or strategies to cope with symptoms on his/her own. Stressors common to old age are especially difficult for those with personality disorders, and the disorders themselves can evolve and change with age. This Round Table Discussion will draw on you clinical experience and thoughts about management in home or LTC settings.
